Introduction

This booklet outlines details of projects funded under both the **Gender Equality** and the **Integration and Employment of Migrants** streams of the European Social Fund (ESF) Programme for Employability, Inclusion and Learning Operational Programme 2014-2020 ('PEIL').

The European Social Fund (ESF) is the European Union's primary financial instrument for investing in people. The broad objectives of the ESF are to help prevent/ combat unemployment; to make Europe's workforce and companies better equipped to face new challenges and to prevent people losing touch with the labour market through investment in education, skills and employment support.

The PEIL is the Operational Programme through which the ESF is being applied in Ireland and takes into consideration and complements actions in the human capital area at EU and National level that aim to make Europe a more attractive place in which to invest and work, enhancing knowledge and innovation for growth and creating more and better jobs.

Integration and Employment of Migrants

This Activity is aimed at legally resident migrants who are experiencing barriers to participation and employment because of language difficulties, lack of training or social exclusion. This Activity proposes to increase the levels of employability of the participants.

The specific categories of persons targeted by this Activity are as follows:

- EEA Nationals who are resident in Ireland.
- Third Country Nationals (TCN) with permission to enter employment in Ireland.

'Third-country national' means any person who is not a citizen of the Union. Reference to TCN shall be understood to include stateless persons and persons with undetermined nationality.

Following the 2016 Call for Proposals, €3.3 million was made available to five projects funded under this stream.

Gender Equality

The Gender Equality activities are aimed at women in particular and are in two strands:

- Strand A is aimed at women who are currently detached from the workforce and who are interested in entering or re-entering the workforce.
- Strand B is targeted at supporting business women, irrespective of their economic status, to realise their full business potential.

Following the 2016 Call for Proposals in 2016 just over €4 million was made available for Strand A, Women Returning to the Workforce, while €1.2 million was made available for Strand B, Women's Entrepreneurship.

18 projects are funded under both strands of the ESF PEIL Gender Equality Funded Programme.
